NEWS OF TENNESSEE SCIENCE

Dr. Carl Tabb Bahner, of Carson-Newman College, spent the summer of 1957 at the Chester Beatty Research Institute in London.

A special Nuclear Engineering Laboratory will be constructed at the University of Tennessee for training students in the new Department of Nuclear Engineering. The equipment for this laboratory is being purchased with a grant of \$97,000 from the Atomic Energy Commission. Dr. P. F. Pasqua is head of the Department of Nuclear Engineering.

Don Wayne Byerly, instructor in Geology at U-T, has been awarded a Fulbright grant to lecture in Geology at the University of Dacca in East Pakistan. Mr. Byerly will be in Pakistan for about 10 months.
