

TENNESSEE ACADEMY OF SCIENCE VISITING SCIENTIST PROGRAM

The Visiting Scientist Program of the Tennessee Academy of Science (TAS) is a valuable resource for K-12 science education. Currently, over 100 TAS members are willing to volunteer their time to visit a K-12 science class. These scientists feel that personal communication is an important part of a child's science education. To arrange for one of these scientists to visit your classroom, simply contact:

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Your school is within one of three geographical areas—east, middle, and west—of Tennessee that define the structure of the Visiting Scientist Program. Scientists who best match your request for expertise and who reside within your geographical area will be contacted. One of them will then contact the K-12 teacher making the request and arrange for a visit to the classroom.

Does arranging a visit by a TAS scientist cost anything? No. The Visiting Scientist Program is a free, volunteer activity sponsored by the Tennessee Academy of Science.
